


Big Idea

 - Dunbar Low emphasizes the uppercase letters, helpful for patients and families in recognizing/remembering parts of the hospital.




- Nature theme, keeps it fun for the kids and making the designs less cartoonish will stop it from being too childish.


Wall Map





Nurses Station


